REIMAGINING OPERA

The Malta Summer Festival seeks to present opera in an innovative way, bolstering the genre's visibility particularly with younger generations.

Building on the MPO's 20/21 end-of-season Grand Finale which reached 1million views online, the engagement of internationally acclaimed artists underlines the quality presented in the MSF. Additionally, the collaborations between local and foreign practitioners ensure that the festival acts as a bridge promoting Malta as a hub for arts and culture whilst leaving a legacy to the country's creative ecology.

The use of digital platforms and interdisciplinary art forms together with edutainment projects aimed specifically at younger audiences taps the festival's mission of rendering opera more accessible and engaging.

The Malta Summer Festival is presented by the Malta Philharmonic Orchestra (MPO) in collaboration with Arts Council Malta and the Malta Tourism Authority with the support of Hilton Malta, the Ministry for Gozo and the Ministry for the National Heritage, the Arts and Local Government.

CAROL GARCIA

Mezzo Soprano

Carol Garcia is a Spanish mezzo soprano from Barcelona, finalist and winner of several international singing competitions such as Francisco Viñas, Paris Opera competition, Belvedere Competition and Operalia, among others. She was a former member of the Atelier Lyrique in the Paris Opera in 2009, where she started her career as a Baroque and Belcanto specialist and developed her warm and effortless voice singing in and out Europe, Opéra Bastille, Palais Garnier, Luxemburg, Bordeaux, Nantes, Strasbourg, Versailles, Opéra de Montréal, Concertgebouw, Versailles, Salle Pleyel, Milwaukee, Trieste, Parma, Montpellier, Lima, Israel and in Spain she sang in Liceu, Real, Valladolid, Malaga, Ibiza, Teatro de la Zarzuela, National Auditorium, Euskalduna, Las Palmas de Gran Canaria, Coruña and Majorca.

She has performed several times Rosina, Cenerentola, Charlotte, Dorabella, Carmen, Selinda (II Farnace), Concepcion (L'Heure Spagnole), Donna Elvira, La musica, Esperanza and Messaggera in L'Orfeo (Monteverdi), Adonella, Javotte, Stéphano, Piacere (II Trionfo del Tempo e del Disinganno), Jean in Le Portrait de Manon, Martirio (La Casa de Bernarda Alba), Dario (Benamor), Paloma (El barberillo de Lavapiés), Maya (Don Gil de Alcalá). In oratorio she has sung El Amor Brujo (Falla), alto solo in Pergolesi's Stabat Mater and in Mozart's Requiem, alto solo in Bach's St Matthew Passion, Les Madrigaux de Philippe Fénelon, the Spanische Liebeslieder (Schumann), Rossini's Stabat Mater and Canteloube's Songs of the Auvergne.

She has worked with international renowned conductors, such as Bruno Campanella, Philippe Jordan, Daniel Oren, Evelino Pidò, Christoph Alstaedt, Christoph Rousset, Thibault Noally, Oliver Díaz, Miquel Ortega, Andrea Marcon, Lucas Macías, José Miguel Pérez-Sierra, Emmanuel Villaume, Anthony Hermus, Riccardo Frizza, Christopher Franklin, Christoph Campestrini, Alessandro D'Agostini, Diego Fasolis, George Petrou, Antonello Allemandi, Sergio Alapont, Giancarlo del Monaco, Coline Serreau, Emilio Sagi, David McVicar, Claus Guth, Clarac-Deloeuil, Ted Huffmann, Giulio Ciabatti, Laurent Pelly, amongst others.

Carol has recorded in Auditorio Nacional de Madrid in a concert with music of Manuel García with Christoph Rousset, and 2 records with IBS label, one with an integral of Granados's songs and Falla's "El corregidor y la Molinera".





JOSÉ GARCÍA GUTIÉRREZ

José García Gutiérrez is an accomplished French-horn professor and performer from Alicante, Spain. He has held several distinguished posts, such as co-principal horn of the Orquesta Filarmonica de Gran Canaria (1997-1999), and principal horn (2000-2001); co-principal horn of the Orquesta de Galicia (2001-2002), principal horn of the Orquesta Sinfonica de Navarra (2002-2003), and principal horn of the Orquesta Sinfonica de Extremadura (2004-2007). Since November 2007 he has been principal horn with Spain's prestigious Orquesta de Radio Television Española (ORTVE) and in 2018 was appointed principal horn of the ADDA Sinfonica, Alicante. As guest performer he has had concert engagements as soloist or principal horn with several orchestras, including the London Symphony Orchestra, Orchestra Teatro alla Scala, Sydney Symphony Orchestra, Vienna Radio Orchestra, Mahler Chamber Orchestra, Sichuan Symphony Orchestra, Orquesta de Cadaques, Orquesta Sinfonica de Tenerife, Orquesta de Granada, Orquesta Sinfonica de Bilbao, Orquesta Sinfonica de Elche and Orquesta Sinfonica de Murcia.

He has recorded Mozart's Wind Octet with the Gustav Mahler Jugendorchester Octet; "Soliloquies" for solo horn and "Trio Concertante" by Maltese composer Joseph Vella; and the Horn Concerto and "Ecloque" by Maurice Blower together with the Malta Philharmonic Orchestra, as well as a CD of chamber music released in 2019 with Argotti Ensemble featuring works by Schumann and Glière amongst others. He is also active as a teacher, particularly with the prestigious Brass Academy in Alicante, and since September 2019 is Artistic Director of the Malta Youth Orchestra.





BRITT AREND

Belgian-Danish harpist Britt Arend studied with Susanna Mildonian at the Royal Conservatory in Brussels, obtaining her Master's degree in 2001.

She furthered her musical education with Maria Graf at the Hochschule Hanns Eisler in Berlin, then at the Accademia del Teatro alla Scala in Milan, and at the Accademia di Santa Cecilia in Rome, where she was awarded the Diploma di Perfezionamento in 2006.

In addition, she attended summer courses at the Accademia Chigiana in Siena, at the Mozarteum in Salzburg, at the Festival des Arcs and Festival of Gargilesse, as well as masterclasses with Isabelle Moretti, Susann MacDonald, Marie-Claire Jamet and Germaine Lorenzini.

Britt won the first prize of the Berlingske Tidende National Music Contest in Copenhagen in 1995, and in 2004 obtained the Dronning Ingrids Romeske Fond's scholarship to stay at the Danish Institute in Rome.

Before being appointed Principal Harp of the Malta Philharmonic Orchestra in 2008, Britt has appeared with other European orchestras, including Teatro dell'Opera di Roma, Teatro Lirico di Cagliari, Dresdner Sinfoniker, Radio-Sinfonie Orchester Frankfurt, Philharmonische Orchester Kiel, RTE Concert Orchestra Dublin, Opera Royal de Wallonie, and Orchestre Philharmonique de Liège.

She has performed as soloist with the Malta Philharmonic Orchestra and with the Armenian State Symphony Orchestra.

Britt has also performed extensively in Malta and Europe as a chamber musician, and has recorded three CDs - Harmonie in 2021 with Moldavian soprano Tatiana Lisnic; Cantilena in 2019 with Maltese soprano Gillian Zammit and cellist Frank Camilleri, and Aprile in 2015 with Gillian Zammit and mezzo-soprano Clare Ghigo.
